



Spring 2026

It has been a remarkably warm, dry winter, and forecasts suggest spring will follow suit - this may well advance growth and bring on an early vintage. While rainfall has been lower than usual, we do have water stored—though if summer turns into another scorcher, supplies will certainly be tested. Pressure is already showing across the region; we have contract clients who simply don't have enough water to see them through summer and are currently having to make the hard choice of which wines to make and which fruit to drop on the ground.

In the winery, we have been busy racking red wines from barrel, assessing them for blending and additions, and returning them to barrel to continue their maturation. As the winter has been so warm, we have also completed a couple of tirage batches (bottled sparkling wines for secondary fermentation)—a task we usually leave for when the weather warms in spring. There has also been a lot of disgorging and labelling of new stock.

With spring comes the wine show season, and we were thrilled to receive some fantastic recent reviews from Ray Jordan. The GSM featured in your last member pack scored an outstanding 96 points. The 2026 Vermentino (in this pack) scored 95 points, the 2025 Chardonnay (from the autumn pack) scored 95 points, and the 2026 Rosé (also in this pack) earned 93 points alongside a Trophy at the Swan Valley Wine Show!

We are also excited to introduce a Reserve range to the MyattsField suite of wines. This pack contains our newly named and newly packaged Shiraz Touriga Durif: **Três Varas**. The name is Portuguese (so all the letters are pronounced) for *three staffs* or *three pillars*. Soon to join Três Varas will be our Wilyabrup Reserve Chardonnay and a Reserve Shiraz, and the next Joseph Myatt Reserve (we are very hopeful one will come out of the 2026 vintage) will also take on the new-look packaging.

Our spring calendar is full of events, and our Tête-à-Tête à Trois challenge is back! If you missed out on tickets to the dinner at Colaba Social in September, don't worry—we are hosting two Tête-à-Tête à Trois Masterclasses in the winery in October (tickets available now online). We will also be attending Unwined Subiaco this October, and hosting an evening of Jazz in the Vines in November, along with some super fun guided art workshops with local and very talented artist Kate Allen. 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- **2023 Methode Traditionelle Chenin (*Left Field Club release only*)** Made in the traditional method, the fruit was harvested from an old vineyard in Chidlow in the Perth Hills, gently pressed, and fermented in stainless steel before undergoing secondary fermentation in the bottle. This wine served as the base for our sparkling rosé, but we kept a portion aside to age on yeast lees and present as a dedicated lees-aged sparkling Chenin.
- **2026 Vermentino (*Pre-release*)** *Ray Jordan: 95 pts / Silver, Swan Valley Wine Show* "Another first-rate example of this variety from MyattsField, which has established something of a benchmark for Vermentino in recent year. The aim has been to really retain those fresh apple, pear, and citrus characters, and it has done that admirably, especially on the nose. The palate is vibrant within its light framework, delivering a nice cut pear and pithy lemon character. A terrific example of an Italian variety well suited to our climate" - Ray Jordan.
- **2025 Chenin Blanc (*Pre-release*)** So new that this pack is the first time it has gone out to review. Chenin is the hot trend right now, with winemakers everywhere giving it a go—it is exceptionally well suited to warming summers and versatile across many winemaking approaches (as seen in our TTT challenge). Fermented in stainless steel to retain fresh Granny Smith apple and Josephine pear characters, the palate remains full and textural.
- **2026 Rosé** *Ray Jordan: 93 pts / Trophy for Best Rosé, 2026 Swan Valley Wine Show.* "A blend of Mourvèdre, Grenache, and Viognier. The Viognier adds a spicy lift on the nose and finish that is most appealing. It displays a pale onion-skin pink hue, with an aroma dominated by rose petal, strawberry, and dried herb. The palate is zingy yet textural, finishing dry with a subtle savouriness" - Ray Jordan. Get in early if you want it—past vintages haven't lasted long!
- **2024 Shiraz (*Pre-release*)** *Ray Jordan: 94 pts* - "In such a warm, in fact quite hot, vintage as '24, it is quite remarkable that a wine of such finesse and plush softness has been produced. The fruit is generous, but almost medium-bodied with admirable restraint. It saw a mix of old and new French and American oak, and that American oak, I think, plays an important part in the feel on the palate. It's a mix of Perth Hills and Swan Valley fruit, and it's loaded with some dark fruits, a little spicy dark chocolate and some slightly earthy notes. Precisely integrated, and that slightly spicy, peppery finish provides a lovely lift".
- **2025 Três Varas** Portuguese for *three staffs* or *three pillars*, this is the new look and new name for our Shiraz Touriga Durif, launching our Reserve range. The finest fractions of each variety are selected and blended to create this exceptional wine: Shiraz provides richness and volume, Touriga introduces vibrant aromatics and complexity, and Durif ensures power, structure, and drive. Together, they create a bold, beautifully balanced, and profoundly complex wine.
